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- 1	Guarantee of origin: cheese is a product of the triad of land, animals and man. This is why we only offer products that are based on expertise and traditions linked to a particular region, and which for the most part bear the official label of quality and origin (AOP, IGP or BIO). Our aim is to always guarantee provenance and traceability, to let you enjoy rare and exceptional cheeses.
- 2	Selection by taste: all our cheeses are tasted regularly so we can offer you high quality products with varied and multiple flavours.
- 3	Our cheeses are selected from the best cheese makers and cheese ripeners in France: from the cellars of Hervé Mons to the Rivoire Jacquemin family, including the Burgundy cheese makers, Lincet and Gaugry, Thierry Chévenet's goats' cheese and Brie de Meaux from the Dongé family. We look for excellence and focus on the expertise of the "great producers" who respect their produce, from milk production right through to the aging process.
- 4	We promote ecologically friendly products that give farmers, cheese producers and ripeners a fair return.
- 5	Our dishes are home made using fresh seasonal produce! Our lettuce is freshly picked, our pastry is lovingly hand crafted and our fruit and vegetables are seasonal.
- 6	We respect the taste and essence of natural products to give you an authentic experience.
- 7	We guarantee high-quality cured meats, of French origin, made from pigs reared in the Ile de France region for cooked ham and Paris salami.
- 8	All our bread is made by local artisan bakers.
- 9	Our wines are carefully selected: Sancerre Domaine Delaporte, Gevrey Chambertin domaine Antonin Guyon, Chablis from Domaine Brocard; and there is a wine for every cheese: we will guide you through classic combinations to surprising discoveries!
